JUNGIAN ODYSSEY

The Jungian Odyssey is a part of the regular summer semester program at ISAPZURICH, taking place off campus each year in a different region of Switzerland. With a retreat setting of lectures, seminars and workshops, the Odyssey affords the intensive study of a particular theme as it emerges in many areas of Jungian theory and practice. To mention a few: dream, fairytale, myth, pictures, bodymind, clinical practice, socio-political affairs.

Our essential purpose is to invite study and discussion in the landscapes that so influenced C.G. Jung's sense of psyche, and thus also the development of Analytical Psychology. At this occasion we open our post-graduate Jungian program to all students and professionals involved in psychology and related fields – and we welcome as well all others with interest in Jung.



2007 EXPLORING THE OTHER SIDE

Like the Jungian Odyssey 2006, the Odyssey 2007 takes place in the heart of Switzerland, this time in Gersau at Lake Lucerne. On a mountain opposite Gersau lies the famous Rütli Meadow. According to legend it was here that Wilhem Tell defied the foreign oppressors — and here

was signed the 1291 pact that united the first 3 cantons and laid the foundation for the future confederation. It is little wonder that the region allured visionaries like Friedrich Nietzsche, Richard Wagner, James Joyce and C.G. Jung himself. This temenos – with its models of life between freedom and prescribed meanings – strikes the keynote for the Jungian Odyssey 2007.

VENUE, COST & REGISTRATION

This year's Odyssey takes place at the 4-star Hotel Rotschuo, located on a mountain bluff and prized for lush, enchanting garden pathways that descend to the lake. With early registration the comprehensive conference fee per person is EUR 1994.00 (includes single room & board) or EUR 1909.00 (includes double room & board). SPECIAL EVENTS ODYSSEY TO LUCERNE

Among the Odyssey's special events is a ship ride on the breath-taking Lake Lucerne. Doing what was forbidden, the youthful C.G. Jung once tried to launch a boat on this lake. Cruising past the Rütli meadow, towering mountains come into view — Tödi, Pilatus, Mythen, Rigi. We will debark in Lucerne, situated on the Reuss River and known for its cobbled lanes, wooden bridges, twin-spired cathedral, the dying lion statue.

Here, where you are free to explore on your own, you might walk from the harbor to the directly adjoining Culture and Congress Center designed by the French architect Jean Nouvel. We further suggest a visit to the Wagner and Picasso museums – or the Rosengart Collection, which holds over 200 modernist works, including pieces by the likes of Braque, Dufy, Klee, Monet, Picasso, Renoir. The ship ride back to Rotschuo will take place under the stars.

EXCURSION TO MT RIGI

When Mark Twain ascended the majestic Rigi, only to fall into exhausted sleep and miss the sunrise he had set out see, he wrote of his Swiss travel advisor: "I dropped him a line to inform him that when he said the foot-journey from Weggis to the summit was only three



hours and a quarter, he missed it by just about three days".*

Jung on the other hand was sent in boyhood by his father to ride the cable car alone to summit, and was filled with wonder: "Yes, I thought, this is it, the real world, the secret, where there are no teachers, no schools, no unanswerable questions, where one can *be*, without having to ask anything. I kept carefully to the paths, for there were tremendous precipices all around. It was all very solemn, and I felt one had to be polite and silent up here, for one was in God's world. Here it was physically present. This was the best and most precious gift my father had ever given me." Jung was revisited for decades by the memories of such genius loci, which he said always assuaged his need for rest and contemplation. We will *ride* to Rigi-Kulm, and from there, follow in Jung's footsteps to enter this awe-inspiring mountain world.

Donations to AGAP for ISAP are exempt from general communal, cantonal and federal tax in Switzerland. ISAP is an extraordinary member of the Swiss Charta for Psychotherapy, and thereby recognized as a psychotherapy training institution by the Health Department of Canton Zurich.

On the home turf of the renowned psychologist C.G. Jung, ISAPZURICH conducts full-time post-graduate training that leads to a Diploma in Analytical Psychology. True to the Zurich tradition ISAP's faculty members, guest instructors and trainees from around the world enrich the program with a variety of professional and cultural backgrounds. Lectures and seminars are held in German and English, while personal analysis and supervision are conducted in a number of other languages.
